

**Scott and Ellen Hollander** came to the Capital District after graduating from Cornell University in 1973. Ellen continued her studies at the University at Albany's School of Public Affairs, while Scott began his career at GardenWay Manufacturing and later earned his MBA from RPI's Lally School of Management.

For more than four decades, Scott has been deeply involved with the Albany JCC, serving on the Board of Directors and numerous committees. Following his retirement from the private sector, he returned as Interim Executive Director of the JCC, helping strengthen staff and member relations and guiding the search for new leadership. He later served twice as Interim Executive Director of Jewish Family Services, helping stabilize the organization during periods of transition. Scott continues to serve on the JCC Board after many years of civic and professional leadership, including a distinguished career in senior human resources management and teaching roles at several regional colleges and universities.

Ellen spent over 15 years working in the New York State Legislature before building a 25-year career in association management, leading several nonprofit and professional organizations. She also taught as adjunct faculty at local colleges. In retirement, Ellen volunteers with Jewish Family Services, assisting seniors through transportation and Kosher Meals on Wheels programs, and helped establish two twelve-step recovery groups at the JCC.

The Albany JCC has long been central to the Hollander family's life — from Ellen's parents' participation in senior programs to their children's involvement in camps and youth activities, continuing today through family connections across generations.
